

Second open show on art

ABOUT 190 paintings, prints, photographs and sculptures by 99 artists will be featured at the National Art Gallery's *Open Show 1985* from Wednesday until Feb. 21.

The exhibition, the gallery's first of the year, is sponsored by Shell Companies in Malaysia, who are reported to have contributed \$50,000 to the project.

Open Show 1985 will later travel to Miri, Kuching and Kota Kinabalu.

This will be the second *Open Show* since the gallery moved to its new premises at 1, Jalan Hishamuddin in Kuala Lumpur.

The first was held last May.

According to a gallery spokesman, *Open Show 1985* will be followed by exhibitions featuring paintings from Denmark's Skagen Museum, the fourth *Asean Exhibition of Painting and Photography*, *Art To Wear* from the United States, an exhibition of *Bangladesh Art Today* and the *Young Contemporaries* exhibition.

There are also plans for an exhibition of contemporary Malaysian photographs, an exhibition of traditional architecture in South-East Asia and one on contemporary Philippines art.



'Union of the Mind' by Syed Thajudeen will be among those on show.
